"California Statutes & Regulations for the Division of Oil, Gas & Geothermal Resources (DOGGR) – April 2019 edition" is going to be used as reference in the class. **Updates on new released UIC & Idle Well Program regulations will be discussed in the class.** General statutes and regulations will be illustrated in new drills, injection wells, abandoned wells, idle well programs. We will discuss well stimulation (SB4) application and inspection requirements. Underground injection control (UIC) and aquifer exemption application processes will be illustrated with general examples. With the above illustrations, you will be able to understand the relationship among EPA, Water Board, Kern County, BLM and DOGGR in permitting and project review processes. **Actual field cases will be presented in the class.**
